#### Contextualising Research

- Think critically about the meaning and purpose of research.
- Consider your epistemological framework and some possible alternatives.
- Recognise how sociopolitical history has shaped your research.
- Examine how your personal experience and circumstances affect your work.



- Recognise how your values and motivations influence your research.
- Examine the diversity of your literature and seek to expand this.
- Understand meaningful collaboration and build this in from the start.



## **Designing** a Research Project

- Identify different potential biases and where they might occur.
- Consider who or what your data aims to represents and what might be missing.
- Construct research partnerships based on equity that share power.
- Think about how to ensure your research is as accessible as possible.
- Ensure your budget containes everything you need to make your research inclusive.
- Engage with open research practices like preregistration and registered reports.
